



What's the benefit of going back to college to earn your bachelor's degree in *Nursing, Ministry or Criminology*?

- **\$1,600 more in your paychecks monthly (\$60,000 compared to \$40,600 annually)¹**

What's the cost of going back to college at Tabor to earn your bachelor's degree?

- **\$20,000 (tuition, fees and books)**

How long does it take to pay back \$20,000 in student loans?

- **At 10 years it is \$219 monthly**
- **At 7 years it is \$289 monthly**

How long does it take to payback your loans if you used all your extra monthly income?

- **12.3 months**

How much will you have earned in the five years following the payback of your loans using your extra money in paychecks?

- **\$96,000**

Note: This scenario does not take into account any grants, scholarships, VA benefits, or personal savings--- only usage of student loans. If these were to be included, the financial benefit is even greater for the student.
